HORTICULTURAL CORNER

Burlap wrap shrubs & ornamentals if recently planted (1-3 years) or fragile

Use anti desiccant (Wilt Proof) on broadleaf evergreens (rhododendrons, azaleas, evergreens)

Mulch 2-3 inches with chopped leaves or pine needles that you stockpiled.
