BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this Club shall be the Academy Garden Club of Lenox.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

Its object shall be to promote interest in horticulture, artistic arrangements, and education.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Active members must pay yearly dues of \$30. (Changed in 2012) Members in arrears shall be notified in a timely manner and if after receiving one reminder and a note from the Treasurer concerning nonpayment of dues they shall be dropped from membership.

Active members must participate in one fund-raising activity and one civic project.

Active members must attend at least 5 meetings a year. Meetings are held 9 times a year.

If an Active member cannot fulfill the guidelines laid down for membership due to unusual circumstances they may request an extension or waiver from the Membership Committee with the approval of the Executive Committee. Such circumstances could include serious illness or changing family circumstances.

To accommodate individuals who wish to participate in some club activities but cannot meet the requirements for active membership, a category of **Associate** member has been developed.

Associate members must pay yearly dues of \$40 (changed in 2012). If these dues are not paid within two months of the yearly notice, associate members will be dropped from the membership roster.

Associate members must attend at least 3 meetings a year.

When meetings involve workshop activities, active members shall take precedence over associate members in cases of limited participation.

A new member may join at any time by paying the annual dues fee.

ARTICLE IV - ELECTION

Section 1. A Nominating Committee of two or more persons shall be appointed by the President to prepare a slate of officers. This slate shall be presented for acceptance at the May meeting. Floor nominations shall also be accepted at this time. Final presentation and voting will take place at the June meeting. These officers will assume their new positions effective September.

Section 2. The term for President will be for one year. The term for Vice President will be for one year with the person in that position moving into the President's position for the following year.

No person shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms; a term consists of two years. For the second term of Treasurer, after the first term, two non-officers will audit the Treasurer's records. Changed 2018.

Section 3. Vacancies shall be filled by the President with the approval of the Executive Board.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

Section 1. The Club shall meet at least 9 months of the year.

Section 2. There will be 2 or more open meetings per year.

Workshops and dinner meetings will not be open meetings.

Section 3. The final meeting shall be called the Annual Meeting, at which time the annual reports shall be given and officers shall be elected.

Section 4. Business can be conducted with the approval of a majority of the members present unless a quorum is requested. Section 4a. Seven active members shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI - LIST OF OFFICERS AND DUTIES

Section 1. The President shall preside at the meetings of the Club, see that the provisions of the by-laws are carried out, and assume all duties assigned by custom to that office. The

President shall act as a member ex-officio of all committees. The President shall not vote except in the event of a tie.

Section 2. The Vice-President shall assist the President, and

shall preside at meetings in the absence of the President.

Section 3. The Recording/Corresponding Secretary shall keep a full and complete record of the proceedings of each meeting, shall have custody of the records of the Club, and take the roll at each meeting, and be responsible for all correspondence.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall have charge of the general funds. The Treasurer shall receive income and pay the bills of the Club after such bills are presented to the Club and approved by a majority vote.

Section 5. The Publicity Chairman shall be responsible for publicity.

ARTICLE VII - STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. There shall be the following Standing Committees: Nominating, Program, Handbook, Hospitality, Horticulture and Civic Projects.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall consist of all elected officers, the most recent past president, and chairmen of all standing committees. It shall meet by order of the President and oversee the general direction of affairs. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. The committee in charge of a project has the authority to cancel that project with the approval of the President if in its best judgment that project becomes unworkable.

ARTICLE VIII - DUES

Section 1. The dues shall be \$30 (changed 2012) per year payable by June 30 and delinquent by July 31. Non-payment of dues will result in removal from active membership.

Section 2. Any expense above \$100.00 incurred by an extra-curricular activity must be approved by two-thirds vote of the membership present.

ARTICLE IX - HOSPITALITY

The Hospitality Chairman shall submit any bills to the Treasurer

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be amended at a regular meeting by a two-thirds majority vote of those present, providing such amendment shall have been presented to the Club in writing at one regular meeting immediately preceding the one in which the action is to be taken.

ARTICLE XI

In the event of dissolution, all the remaining assets and property of the organization shall, after payment of necessary expenses, be distributed to such organization as shall qualify under Section 501 C (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal Tax Law or to the Federal Government, a State or Local government for public purpose, subject to the approval of a court of competent jurisdiction within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

ARTICLE XII

The Academy Garden Club of Lenox shall not permit in their conduct of club affairs, any restriction or limitation whatsoever based upon race, color, creed, gender, and national origin or employment status.

ARTICLE XIII

The fiscal year of the Academy Garden Club of Lenox shall be from July 1 to June 30.
