

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CAYS AND MEANS COMPITTEES

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ARTICLE Is a NAME NAME OF THE STATE OF

The name of this Club shall be the Lenox Academy Garden Club.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT and Sent Islands end

Its object shall be to promote interest in horticulture, artistic arrangements, and education.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The active membership of this Club shall be open to all.

Section 2. All resignations shall be in writing directed to the Recording Secretary.

ARTICLE IV .- ELECTION

Section 1. A Nominating Committee of two or more persons shall be appointed by the President to prepare a slate of officers.

This slate shall be presented for acceptance at the February meeting. Floor nominations shall also be accepted at this time. Final presentation and voting will take place at the March meeting. These officers will assume their new positions effective April.

Section 2. No person shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms; a year constitutes one term.

Section 3. Vacancies shall be filled by the President with the approval of the Executive Board.

Section 1. The Club shall meet once a month.

Section 2. The final meeting shall be called the Annual Meeting, at which time the annual reports shall be given.

Section 3. Business can be conducted with the approval of a majority of the members present unless a quorum is requested.

Section 3a. One-half of the active members shall constitute a quorum.

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Section 3b. If a quorum is requested, absentee ballots may be mailed to those not present and must be returned to the Recording Secretary within ten (10) days of the meeting.

Section 4. Votes involving money shall be taken in writing. Anyone can request a paper ballot at any time.

ARTICLE VI - LIST OF OFFICERS AND DUTIES

Section 1. The President shall preside at the meetings of the Club, see that the provisions of the By-Laws are carried out, and assume all duties assigned by custom to that office. The President shall act as a member ex-officio of all committees. The president shall not vote except in the event of a tie.

Section 2. The Vice-President shall assist the President, shall preside at meetings in the absence of the President and perform such other duties as requested by the President. The Vice-President will assist with auditing the books at the end of the fiscal year.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep a full and complete record of the proceedings of each meeting, shall have custody of the records of the Club, call the roll at each meeting, and render a report at the Annual Meeting.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall have charge of the general funds. The Treasurer shall receive income and pay the bills of the Club after such bills are presented to the Club and approved by a majority vote; also, to assist the Vice-President in the yearly audit.

Section 5. The Corresponding Secretary shall be responsible for all correspondence.

Section 6. The Reporter shall be responsible for publicity and publishing the monthly newsletter, and be standing chairman of publicity.

ARTICLE VII. STANDING COMMITTEE

Section 1. There shall be the following Standing Committees: Nominating, Program, Handbook, Ways and Means, Hostess, and Civic Project.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall consist of the elected officers and chairmen of the following committees; Nominating, Program, Civic Project, Ways and Means, and will meet by order of the President of the Club. It shall oversee the general direction of affairs. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. The committee in charge of a project has the authority to cancel that project with the approval of the President if in its best judgment that project becomes unworkable.

Sectional. The dues shall be \$5.00 per year payable by April 30 and delinquent by June 30.

Section 2. Any Expense above \$25.00 incurred by an extra-curricular activity must be approved by a two-thirds vote of the membership present.

ARTICLE IX - HOSTESS of eleaen ens

The Hostess Committee each month will be reimbursed for expenses up to 10¢ per member, upon presenting a bill. When an open meeting is scheduled, additional funds will be decided by the Executive Committee. The Chairman of the Hostess Box will be reimbursed for restocking the box.

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended at a regular meeting by a two-thirds majority vote of those present, providing such amendment shall have been presented to the Club in writing at one regular meeting immediately preceding the one in which action is to be taken.


